HEALTH CARE MINISTRY OF THE CONGREGATION

The Sisters provide care for the sick and work for the health of the whole person—physical, social and spiritual—and that of the community. They engage in the struggle for justice by working to alleviate the conditions that cause suffering and advocating for the needs of the underserved.

ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS OF THE HEALTH CARE MINISTRY

DIGNITY OF PERSON

We respect life, dignity of person, the common good and the social and ethical teachings of the Catholic Church.

CARE FOR THE POOR

We allocate resources for the poor and underserved. We serve the MediCal/Medicaid and uninsured population and annually set aside an established percentage of net income for care of the medically indigent.

BODY, MIND, SPIRIT

We provide resources for excellent, compassionate care of the whole person—body, mind and spirit.

CARE FOR THE COMMUNITY

We respond to the needs of the community, advocate for just public policies, and participate in appropriate social action as key components in the creation of healthy communities.

QUALITY OF WORK LIFE

Work is an expression of the dignity of the worker. We provide a work life characterized by justice, dignity and collaboration. Equitable salary scales and benefits, a safe environment, and opportunities for growth and development are expressions of this commitment.

SPONSORSHIP OF ST. JOSEPH HEALTH

Sponsorship is the responsibility and moral accountability for, support of, influence on and public identification with a project, program, or entity which furthers congregational goals.

From the inception of St. Joseph Health in 1982, the elected leadership of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange acting as the corporate member exercised the responsibilities of sponsorship.

In 2008, the responsibilities of sponsorship were transferred to St. Joseph Health Ministry, a church corporation composed of members of the founding congregation and the laity.
